## Rights Responsibilities Costs and Benefits





- Rights of a citizen to health care
- Not dependent on other activities or areas of a persons life.
- Examples and judgement calls which challenge.
- Complications that come with problematic AOD use.



# Responsibilities

- Responsibilities of the person requiring treatment.
  - Frequently disregarded due to AOD use.
- Responsibility of society.
  - Context of our environment
  - Treatment is an entitlement to any citizen who has need.
  - Society's views and expected outcomes often conflicting



## Costs

Costs to the individual

#### Harm to life across all aspects

- Health
- Family relationships
- Legal consequences
- Employment and education
- Accommodation
- Financial

Costs to families must also be recognised



## Costs

Cost to society – both of treating and of not treating

#### Treating a person

- Restore person to active participation
- Restore to contributing to community
- Saves costs in range of areas (health legal)
- Increases productivity

# Evidence to support cost benefits of treatment



#### Costs of not treating

- Disregard of the health needs of a citizen
- Stigmatisation
- Increasing costs of enforcement and other health costs.
- Increasing harm to the community
- Loss of productivity
- Legal consequences which compound harm



## **Barriers and consequences**

- What prevents people accessing treatment
  - Even when it is a right!
  - Stigma and shame
  - Legal consequences of their drug use
  - Illegal activities which may be exposed.
